George Eastman's Kodak Camera. George Eastman was an avid photographer who became the founder of the Eastman Kodak company. Eastman wanted to simplify photography to make it available to everyone, not just trained photographers. In 1883, Eastman announced the invention of a new kind of film that came in rolls.

George Eastman, (born July 12, 1854, Waterville, New York, U.S.—died March 14, 1932, Rochester, New York), American entrepreneur and inventor whose introduction of the first Kodak camera helped to promote amateur photography on a large scale. After his education in the public schools of Rochester, New York, Eastman worked briefly for an insurance company and a bank.

In 1886 a detective camera was patented by George Eastman and F. M. Cossitt (patent No. 353545) which failed in the market but was a precursor of the famous Kodak handheld camera from 1888. Some of the concepts in the detective camera design were used later in 1888.

George Eastman: The Invention of the Kodak Hand-Held Camera

Eastman introduced the Kodak box camera in 1888, which used his roll film and film holder. Users would expose up to 100 images, send the camera and film to the Eastman company and would then get back prints of the negatives and the camera loaded with a new roll of film. This represented a true revolution.

Through his introduction to his simple-to-operate roll-film Kodak camera, George Eastman made photography accessible to virtually all people. 1888: George Eastman invented the first roll-film camera. 1948: The Polaroid allowed people to take a photo and have it developed instantly from the bottom of the camera. 1963: Polaroid came out with the first coloured film. 1980: Sony debuted the first consumer camcorder, allowing people to record their memories using video.

George Eastman continued to expand his business. In 1900, he purchased the Blair Camera Company of Boston, and the American Camera Company of Northboro, Massachusetts. At the same time the Brownie was introduced, E. &H.T. Anthony & Co. offered to sell out to Eastman, too.

U.S. patent no. 388,850, issued to George Eastman, September 4, 1888 In 1884, Eastman patented the first film in roll form to prove practicable; he had been tinkering at home to develop it. In 1888, he developed the Kodak Black camera ("Kodak" being a word Eastman created), which was the first camera designed to use roll film.
