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Nyc Doe Grade 8 Promotion

Principals make promotion decisions based on the English language arts and math skills shown in the student's portfolio. Students in grade 8 must also pass the following courses in order to be promoted:

Promotion Policy - New York City Department of Education

The site navigation utilizes arrow, enter, escape, and space bar key commands. Left and right arrows move across top level links and expand / close menus in sub levels.

Grade by Grade - New York City Department of Education

Promotion decisions in grades K-8 are based on a holistic review of student work to determine whether they have mastered the skills for the next grade level in specific subject areas. For grades 3-8, schools set their own grade-level promotion benchmarks based on multiple measures.

Principals make promotion recommendations based on the English language arts and math skills demonstrated in each student's portfolio. ELLs in grade 8 will be held to varying promotion criteria based on their number of years of enrollment in a United States school system (USSS) and status as a Student with Interrupted Formal Education (SIFE).⁴ A student's number of years of enrollment in a USSS is maintained in the UYRE screen in ATS.
